Tip:

To keep stems straight for showing, roll their entire length in damp newspaper, place in warm water. Keeps for days.

Flowers

1. Amaranth, 1 stem
2. Aster, 3 sprays
3. Begonia, 1 bloom floating in a bowl
4. Calendula, 3 blooms
5. Cleome (Spider Plant), 3 stems
6. Coleus, 3 stems
7. Coneflower (Echinacea), any colour, 3 blooms
8. Cosmos, 5 stems
9. Gloriosa Rubeckia, (Daisy), 3 stems
10. Dahlia, 1 bloom and foliage, 15 cm or over
11. Dahlia, 1 bloom and foliage, under 15 cm
12. Gaillardia, 3 blooms
13. Geranium, 1 stem with foliage
14. Gladiolus, any colour, 1 spike
15. Gladiolus, variegated, 1 spike
16. Gladiolus, any variety, 3 spikes
17. Hosta, 3 leaves, same variety
18. Hydrangea, 1 stem ball type
19. Hydrangea, 1 stem cone type
20. Lavatera, 3 stems
21. Marigold, 3 blooms, 7.5 cm or over, with own foliage
22. Marigold, 5 blooms, under 7.5 cm, with own foliage
23. Mums, 3 sprays
24. Pansies and Violas, 5 stems with own foliage
25. Phlox, any variety, 3 stems
26. Petunia, double, 3 sprays
27. Petunia, single, 3 sprays
28. Salvia, 3 stems, any colour
29. Sedum, 3 stems, new variety if possible
30. Snapdragon, any colour 3 spikes
31. Sunflower, 3 heads not more than 15 cm
32. Verbena, 3 stems
33. Zinnia, small, 3 stems, 10 cm or less
34. Zinnia, large, over 10 cm, 1 stem
35. Any other annual flower not listed above, named if possible, 3 blooms or stems or 1 large bloom
36. Any other perennial not listed above, named if possible, 3 blooms or stems or 1 large bloom.

37. A container of Herbs, 3 to 5, named if possible.
38. Any other cultivar of bulb, corm or rhizome, up to 5 stems

43. Rose, Grandiflora, 1 stem
44. Rose, Shrub, 1 stem
45. Rose floating in a rose bowl, 1 bloom

46. Any Geranium, in bloom
47. Begonia, Fibrous
48. Impatiens, any variety
49. House Plant in bloom, named if possible
50. House plant grown for its foliage, named if possible
51. Pot of Ivy
52. Cactus or succulent, 1 potted, named if possible
53. Unusual plant, named if possible
54. Plant with a history, story to be included
