6. All entries must remain on display until 6:00 p.m. Wednesday, September 15, 2020. The arena will be locked for the night at 9:30 p.m. Entries may also be picked up between 9:30 a.m. and 11:00 a.m. on Thursday, September 16, 2020.
7. The Fair Board will not be responsible for any entries not picked up by 11:00 a.m. on Thursday, September 16, 2020.
8. All entries are at owner's risk but will be protected as far as possible by Fair Management.
9. Please make sure that the following information appears on the **back** of each entry: **pupil's name** (first & last), **grade, school and teacher's name**.
